



## The Constitutional Dimensions of Academic Freedom

Robert Post is Dean and Sol & Lillian Goldman
Professor of Law at Yale Law School. Before arriving at
Yale, he taught for 20 years at the University of
California, Berkeley School of Law. Dean Post's areas of
expertise include constitutional law, First Amendment law,
legal history, and equal protection. He has written and
edited numerous books, including Democracy, Expertise,
Academic Freedom: A First Amendment Jurisprudence for
the Modern State (2012); and For the Common Good:
Principles of American Academic Freedom (with Matthew
M. Finkin, 2009). Between earning both a BA (summa

cum laude) and a Ph.D. in History of American Civilization from Harvard, Dean Post received his law degree at Yale, where he was Note Editor of the *Yale Law Journal* and won the Michael Egger Prize. He is also a member of the American Philosophical Society and the American Law Institute, and is a fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences.
