The attorney-client privilege preserves the confidentiality of communications between lawyers and their clients.

The privilege protects individuals and institutions. Thus, communications that Harvard faculty and staff have with Harvard attorneys, in confidence, for the purpose of seeking legal advice concerning Harvard legal matters, are protected by the attorney-client privilege from disclosure to opposing parties. Such communications are privileged whether they are oral, written or electronic.
